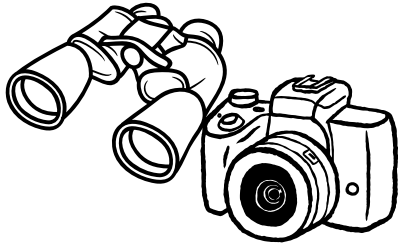


GET INVOLVED IN SOME CITIZEN SCIENCE

Tangaroa Blue Cleanup

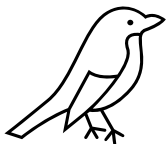
Do an underwater cleanup in the harbour or on a local beach & document the trash that you find in a global database.

If you're lucky enough to spot a shark, especially whale or leopard sharks, snap some photos of their sides and upload to the global catalogue.
